The gifts you offer at Christ's table of welcome, O God, are gifts more significant, more restorative, more nourishing and wholesome than any other gifts we receive. We are deeply grateful for the reach of your love that extends across time and space to find us here today, in your presence, to share in this sacred meal.

Prophets of old reminded us that those who look to you, to receive your gift of love, will be those who, in turn, will give of themselves gladly and willingly, in many places and among the many people you call your own. So help us to live lives of glad generosity, Eternal God, as we wait for the fulfillment in this Advent season, of the great hope of your Son's coming. Show us how to prepare a fitting place for Him. First, let us offer you, God, a thorough-going, heartfelt repentance, setting aside any arrogance or pride that weakens our resolve to see ourselves as we really are.
